Sermon Discussion Questions |Luke 1:26-38

- 1. Can you give examples of how your hopes for the future shape your present?
- 2. Does the doctrine of the virgin birth matter? Why or why not?
- 3. What can we learn from Mary about the role of *doubt* in a healthy faith?
- 4. What does "the word made flesh" teach us about God's concern for our *physical* reality? What does it teach us about God's concern for our *spiritual* reality? How is the God revealed in Jesus Christ unlike any other "god" in holding these together?
- 5. How does Mary's "Let it be unto me according to your word" point us to the "double grace" of Jesus that he is both the *substitute* who took our place and the *king* who more and more rules and subdues sin in us?
- 6. Pray for yourselves and the church, for honesty for a healthy doubt, and persistence in seeking a hope that will not disappoint.
