ADULT EDUCATION & SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES

Every Sunday morning at 9:15am, Christ the King offers classes for adults, youth and children. The topics of these classes reflect the desire of the church to equip its members with a better understanding of God's Word. Adult Education classes are held across the street at the Church Office (130 Prospect Street) and fellowship hall, Jr/Sr High Sunday School walks over together to the church office (130 Prospect Street), and children 2.5 years-6th grade are taught downstairs in the church building.

New Testament Survey:

We will do a fast-paced, high-level overview of the New Testament, to understand the context into which many of the well-known stories sit. Get a better feel for the chronology of the gospels and Acts, and the structure of a typical epistle. We'll spend two weeks digging into two of the largest epistles, and the class will close on May 25 with one lesson on the book of Revelation. It will be taught by Nathan Carter and a number of other CTK members in the fellowship hall.

Pilgrim Theology:

An introductory systematic theology class. We are picking back up from last fall and will continue discussing what the Bible teaches us about God, ourselves, and the great drama that we have been brought into as Christians. We will be working through the topics laid out by Michael Horton in his book, Pilgrim Theology. All are welcome. This class will meet in the Church Office and will be taught by Matthew Huskey (matthewdhuskey@gmail.com).

CHILDCARE ON SUNDAYS

Our nurseries are available throughout the service. The infant (0-12 months) nursery is upstairs through the doors to the right of the stage, while nurseries for 1, 2, and 3-year-olds are available downstairs (also through the door to the right of the stage). Children's church will begin after the passing of the peace and dismissal of children and is divided into two age groups: 4-5 years old in room 5 and 6-7 years old in room 1. There is also a listening area (with a partitioned off space for nursing mothers) in the social hall that will play the entire service for parents who need to take their children out of the service for any reason.
