By your Spirit, O God, take possession of our hearts, so that, not only the actions of our life, but also the words of our mouths, and the smallest thought of our minds, may be guided and governed by you. Leader: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.


Congregation: As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be. Amen.
