Confession of Faith

We join the global and historic church in professing what we believe as Christians, to remind ourselves of the hope we have and the life that hope invites us to live.

Confession of Sin

Assurance of Grace

Confession of Faith

Leader: For what do we pray in the second request (of the Lord's Prayer)?

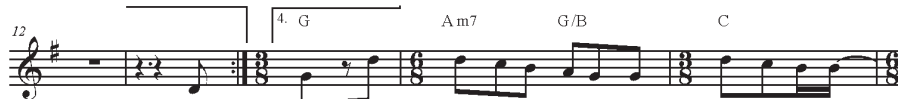
