## Sermon Discussion Questions | 2 Samuel 1:1-16

- Consider David's lament for Jonathan in the second half of the chapter. Talk about the
  importance of friendship (for reference, you can read about David and Jonathan's friendship in 1
  Samuel 18 and 20). What signs do you see in our world that we underplay the importance of
  friendship? What can we do to value it more highly?
- 2. Now consider David's lament for Saul. What does it tell us that, after everything he has been through, David praises Saul rather than cutting him down? How is forgiveness connected to the way we speak about the one who has wronged us when they aren't there to hear us?
- 3. Does forgiveness mean not holding the offender accountable? How does the grace of God in the death and resurrection of Christ affect the answer to this question?
- 4. David's treatment of the Amalekite who struck down the Lord's anointed seems harsh. How do we make sense of this? How is it pointing beyond itself, to *our* treatment of the true anointed one, Jesus?
- 5. Why do you think the Westminster Confession of Faith calls repentance an *evangelical* grace (that is, a *gospel* grace part of the good news)?
- 6. Pray for our church, that the gifts of repentance and reconciliation would be granted by the Holy Spirit, in Christ our champion, who has won them for us.
