Sermon Discussion Questions | [2 Samuel 6](#)

1. What do you know about the ark of the covenant (where it came from, what it was for, where it was kept for most of Israel's history...)? Why is it a big deal?
2. What is significant about David bringing the ark to Jerusalem as one of his first acts as king of the united kingdom?
3. What is your gut reaction to the death of Uzzah? What sense can we make of it?
4. How can it be helpful to us and our understanding of the gospel to realize that sin is not a little obstacle between us and God, but a chasm that we simply cannot bridge "from our side"? (Talk about what that means if it's not a familiar concept.)
5. Read Hebrews 9:24-26. How can you apply the truth that Jesus has "appeared once for all at the end of the ages to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself"?
6. Pray for the church, both for the pastoral transition process and for our apprehension of the truth that we are more sinful than we imagine, and more loved and accepted than we dare hope.
