## Sermon Discussion Questions |Luke 1:39-56

- 1. What is Elizabeth's role in spurring Mary's song? When have you found community important in moving you toward praise and gratitude for God's work in your life?
- 2. What is your gut-level reaction to the "revolutions" in Mary's song (vv. 51-53)?
- 3. What is it that makes the "revolution" that Jesus brings truly radical, one that can end cycles of retribution and revenge?
- 4. Mary, like Hannah, exercises theological imagination in moving from what God is doing in *her* life to what He is doing for His people and the world. How can theological imagination help us as we "watch, and weep, and wait" this Advent?
- 5. How can seeing Jesus empty himself becoming human, submitting to death on a cross help us take hold of the promise that "his mercy is for those who fear him"?
- 6. Pray that God would be at work in our church in this season of waiting, to turn us away from our idols by means of "the explusive power of a new affection."

## **Transition Updates:**

A critical part of the transition process is prayerfully considering the history, mission, and vision for the church. Following a series of interviews, surveys, and interactions with a sample of the CTK congregation, including some staff, officers, and a variety of members, McGowan and Associates have compiled an assessment and a list of recommendations for CTK to consider as a congregation.
