Sermon Discussion Questions | Luke 6:20-26

- 1. Look at the following passages of Scripture and summarize what they teach about wealth:
 - a. Proverbs 10:15; 30:7-9
 - b. Luke 18:9-14, 18-30; 19:1-10
 - c. 1 Timothy 6:6-10, 17-19
 - d. Are there other passage that come to mind?
- 2. After looking at these passage try to articulate what they teach as succinctly as possible. What is Jesus teaching you about wealth from these verses? (Be as specific as possible.)
- 3. Look at the following passages on fasting and summarize what they teach.
 - a. Isaiah 58:6-7
 - b. Daniel 10:1-3
 - c. Matthew 4:1-11 (cf. Mark 1:12-13; Luke 4:1-13)
 - d. Luke 5:33-39
 - e. Are there other passage that come to mind?
- 4. After looking at these passage try to articulate what they teach as succinctly as possible. How is Jesus calling you to respond to his teaching about fasting? (Be as specific as possible.)
- 5. In the sermon we saw that Jesus is the one who lives out the beatitudes in his life. How does his example help <u>you</u> think about living out the ideals of the new community Jesus has called you to be? (Be as specific as possible.)
 - a. Blessed are the poor: Jesus because poor for us (2 Corinthians 8:9)
 - b. Blessed are the hungry: Jesus fasted and thirsted for us (Luke 4:1-13; John 19:28)
 - c. Blessed are those who weep: Jesus wept because of sin (John 11:35; Luke 19:41)
