Sermon Discussion Questions | Luke 6:37-42

- 1. Read Luke 6:20-42. What has Jesus said in Luke 6:20-36 that prepares us for what he says in Luke 6:37-42? How do the beatitudes and woes in particular help us to understand and apply Jesus teaching about the speck and the log?
- 2. Jesus is partly confronting the false teachings of the religious leaders of his day. Read Matthew 5:17-48. Notice that in Matthew the end of this section is the teaching on loving your enemies. How is Jesus setting himself in opposition to the current teachings of his day?
- 3. Watch this short video from CCEF on Christian accountability. What are your thoughts on the distinction between accountability in the sense of helping people say no to sin and accountability as working off the "one-another" passages of Scripture? How have you thought of accountability in the past? Time permitting consider the list of one-another passages below and how they can help us build up, encourage, and hold one-another accountable.
- 4. The sermon mentioned having both an accurate view of ourselves and a gracious view of others. Which of these is harder for you? Why? How is Jesus calling you to address that in your life?
