Sermon Discussion Questions | Luke 19:28-44

- 1. Compare the accounts of the triumphal entry from each of the Gospel (Matthew 21:1-11; Mark 11:1-11; Luke 19:28-40; John 12:12-19).
 - What do we learn about the crowd from these passages?
 - What do we learn about the disciples from these passage?
 - What do we learn about Jesus from these passages?
 - What differences strike you from the different accounts?
- 2. Read Zechariah 9. In Zechariah 9 we are told that the LORD will send his king to Jerusalem to save his people. The passage begins with an oracle against the nations and the moves on to the promise of a king. How would this passage have informed the expectations of the crowd? How does our knowledge of the crowd from John 12:17-18 add to our understanding?
- 3. What do we learn about Jesus from the times he wept? (John 11:35 and Luke 19:41)
- 4. In Luke 19:40 Jesus says that if the crowds were to stop praising him the stones would start where the crowds left off. Is Jesus speaking in hyperbole? How do Psalm 96:11–13, Psalm 98:7–9, & Isaiah 55:12 add to our understudying of what Jesus is saying?
- 5. How can you respond to Jesus as king this week? Where do you need his healing power in your life?
