Sermon Discussion Questions | 1 Samuel 21

- 1. Talk about the theme of "wilderness" (and see Psalm 78:19). Why do you think God continually takes his people into the wilderness to teach them who He is and who they are?
- 2. Read Mark 2:23-26 how does Jesus make use of what David does in 1 Samuel 21? What is the significance of this for us?
- 3. Does it surprise you that Psalm 34 is connected to these events? That is how does such a humbling moment for David lead to a Psalm of praise like this? What do you see in the Psalm that would suggest its origins?
- 4. What stands out to you in Psalm 34?
- 5. Can you give personal examples of times that you have "tasted and seen" that the Lord is good? Or can you talk about long periods when it was *hard* to savor his goodness?
- 6. Pray for the church and for one another, that we would fear the Lord and seek our refuge in him.
